



Frederick Alan Neilen

A lifelong resident of Lower Burrell, Fred, 69, died peacefully in his home, surrounded by family, Wednesday, May 12, 2021, after a courageous six-month battle with cancer. Fred was born Oct. 30, 1951. On that same date in 1971, he married his soul mate and love of his life, Susan (Capiross) Neilen.

They would be celebrating 50 years of marriage this year. Fred was a proud Marine. He enlisted in the Marine Corps on his 17th birthday. He was a Vietnam veteran and was awarded a Purple Heart. He was the owner of Keystone Janitorial Supplies and owner of the Six Pence Bar. He retired from the New Kensington Post Office, where he worked for 30 years. He was the creator and founder of Tri-City Soccer. He held lifelong memberships to the VFW, DAV and the Marine Corps League. In 2017, he was awarded Marine of the Year, which was a great honor to him. He was also an active member of the Westmorland County Vietnam Veterans Association. Fred was a natural-born leader, and that shone through in the many volunteer positions he held. He was co-coordinator for Heroes on Water; District 10 vice commandant to the Department of Pennsylvania Marine Corps League; as well as the vice commandant to the local Allegheny Valley detachment 827 Marine Corps League. Fred took extreme pride in staying active in the Marine

Corps and took great joy in his position as the local regional coordinator for the Allegheny Valley Toys for Tots program. This is something he and his daughter, Jennifer, enjoyed doing together. He enjoyed traveling to Florida to spend time with his son, Jess, and his family. He loved to kayak and fish. He was a member of the River's Edge Fishing Club and a Hobie Kayak team representative. He enjoyed hunting and riding his quad. He especially enjoyed watching his grandson Logan's wrestling matches and rarely ever missed a match. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Susan; a son, Jess (Nicole) Neilen, of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; his two daughters, Jacquelyn (Garth) Stewart, of Mercer, Pa., and Jennifer Neilen, of New Kensington; and his five grandchildren, Reagan, Angelina, Kennedy, Logan and Annabella. He is also survived by his three brothers, Bob Neilen, Brian Neilen and Robin Neilen; and numerous nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his daughter, Nicole; and his parents, Marie Neilen Beers and Robert Neilen. He will also have a heavenly reunion with his best friend, Donnie Briscoe, whom he lost earlier this year.



Legendary Marines

Sgt. Maj. Gilbert
"Hashmark" Johnson

Johnson was one of the first African-Americans to enlist in the Marine Corps. Born in rural Mount Hebron, Alabama, Johnson attended Stillman College in 1922, as-

piring to become a minister. He left college the following year, however, and joined the Army. At the end of his enlistment in October 1929, Johnson was discharged as a corporal. After four years of civilian life, he decided to try the Navy. The Navy accepted Johnson into the steward's Branch, the only job available to blacks at that time, and he served for nearly10 years. Johnson was aboard the USS Wyoming during the bombing of Pearl Harbor in

December 1941. The following year, when President Franklin D. Roosevelt ordered the integration of the armed forces, Johnson requested transfer form the Navy to the Marine Corps. He went on to serve the last 17 of his 32-year

military career in the Marine Corps. Throughout his Marine Corps career Johnson provided leadership to his younger and less experienced comrades. It was at Montford Point he was given the name "Hashmark," because of his age and many years of service.

In 1943, he was among the first black men to be trained as Marine drill instructors. He also served as field sergeant in charge of all recruit training at Montford Point. As a member of the 52d Defense Battalion on Guam in World War II, "Hashmark" asked that black Marines be assigned to combat patrols from which they were currently exempt. Once approved, he personally led 25 combat patrols.

Johnson later served in Korea with the 1st Shore Party Battalion, then later with 2d Battalion, 1st Marines, and finally as administrative advisor at the Headquarters of the Korean Marine Corps. Asked if he had experienced any problems as a senior black NCO serving in predominantly white units, Johnson characteristically said "I didn't encounter any difficulty. I accepted each individual for what he was and apparently they accepted me for what I was."

Johnson went on to become one of the first black sergeants major in the Marine Corps. He transferred to the Fleet Marine Force Reserve in 1957 and retired in 1959. On 5 August 1972 in Jacksonville, North Carolina, he died of a heart attack while addressing an annual meeting of the Montford Point Marine Association. On 19 April 1974, the Montford Point facility at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, was dedicated as Camp Gilbert H. Johnson, Montford Point, Camp Lejeune, in honor of this outstanding Marine.

This Month in Marine Corps History



2 May 1946: Marines from Treasure Island Marine Barracks, under the command of W.O. Charles L. Buckner, aided in suppressing the three-day prison riot at Alcatraz Penitentiary in San Francisco Bay. WO Buckner, a veteran of the Bougainville and Guam campaigns, ably led his force of Marines without suffering a single casualty. 5 May 1983: In Beirut, Lebanon, a UH-1N helicopter carrying the commander of the American peace-keeping force, Colonel James Mead, was hit by machine gun fire. The six Marines aboard escaped injury. Colonel Mead and his crew had taken off in the helicopter to investigate artillery and rocket duels between rival Syrian-backed Druze Moslem militiamen and Christian Phalangists that endangered French members of the multinational force. 8 May 1995: In the wake of the most devastating storm to hit the New Orleans area in more than 200 years, a group of Marines and sailors from Marine Forces Reserve demonstrated the quick response synonymous with the Navy/Marine Corps team. Within 24 hours of being called, Marines assisted in the evacuation of 2,500 civilians, and Navy corpsmen treated scores of victims. 10 May 1945: The 22d Marines, 6th Marine Division, executed a pre-dawn attack south across the Asa River Estuary and seized a bridgehead from which to continue the attack toward Naha, the capital of Okinawa.

15 May 1862: Corporal John Mackie, the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor, was commended for service in the USS GALENA during action against Confederate shore batteries at Drewry's Bluff which blocked the James River approaches to Richmond.

16 May 1945: The 22d and 29th Marines continued the attack against Half Moon Hill, a day characterized by the 6th Marine Division as the "bitterest" of the Okinawa campaign. By the 18th, the famed "Shuri line" had been broached.

22 May 1912: First Lieutenant Alfred A. Cunningham,

the first Marine officer to be assigned to "duty in connection with aviation" by Major General Commandant William P. Biddle, reported for aviation training at the Naval Aviation Camp at Annapolis, Maryland, and Marine aviation had its official beginning.



23 May 1988: The V-22 Osprey (above), the world's first production tilt-rotor aircraft, made its debut during rollout ceremonies at Bell Helicopter Textron's Arlington, Texas, facility. More than 1,000 representatives from the military, industry, and media, gathered to hear various speakers, including Gen Alfred Gray, Commandant of the Marine Corps, praise the versatile rotor craft designed to meet the needs of 21st Century battlefields.

26 May 1969: Operation Pipestone Canyon began when the 1st Battalion, 26th Marines and 3d Battalion, 5th Marines began sweeps in the Dodge City/Go Noi areas southwest of Da Nang. It terminated at the end of June with 610 enemy killed in action at a cost of 34 Marines killed.

29 May 1991: Elements of a joint task force that included the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade departed the Bay of Bengal off the coast of Bangladesh after nearly two weeks of disaster relief operations following a devastating cyclone. The joint task force delivered tons of relief supplies using helicopters, C-130s, and landing craft in Operation Sea Angel.
