<u>Passings</u>

Jim Hockenberger

Detachment member Jim Hockenberger passed away on Saturday night, February 2nd, at the VA Hospital. Jim had suffered with COPD for many years, and it took



him away from what he enjoyed the most, that of being a Marine. He was also a Vietnam Vet. In the early years of our Detachment Jim was very active in all of our activities; parades, memorials, fund raisers, Toys for Tots, pistol shooting, etc. Jim was responsible for getting us involved with the Pittsburgh Air Show, manning a table for recruiting. He had many contacts at the Air base. Jim has been cremated and no date has been established for any service. Please keep his wife Cathy in your prayers.

This Month in Marine Corps History



1 February 1967: Operation Prairie II was begun in Quang Tri province by elements of the 3d Marine Division. During the 46-day search-and-destroy operation which terminated 18 March, 93 Marines and 693 of the enemy were killed.

2 February 1944: The 4th Marine Division, as part of the first assault on islands controlled by the Japanese before the start of World War II, captured Namur and eight other islands in the Kwajalein Atoll.

6 February 1968: Two reduced Marine battalions, the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines with two companies, and 2d Battalion, 5th Marines with three, recaptured Hue's hospital, jail, and provincial headquarters. It would take three more weeks of intense house to house fighting, and nearly a thousand Marines killed and wounded, before the imperial city was secured.

15 February 1998: One hundred years ago this date, 28 Marines and 232 seamen lost their lives when the battleship MAINE was mysteriously sunk by an explosion in the harbor of Havana, Cuba. Though no definitive evidence linked the Spanish with the sinking, the cry went up, "Remember the Maine!", and by late April the U.S. and Spain were at war.

In 1918, the Secretary of Navy allowed women to enroll for clerical duty in the Marine Corps. During that year some 300 women first entered the Marine Corps to take over stateside clerical duties from battle-ready Marines who were needed oversees. June 12th, 1948, Congress passed the Women's Armed Services Integration Act, and made women a permanent part of the regular Marine Corps.

23 February 1945: Four days after the initial landings on Iwo Jima, 1stLt Harold G. Schrier led 40 men from Company E, 2d Battalion, 28th Marines, up Mt. Suribachi to secure the crest and raise the small American flag that battalion commander LtCol Chandler Johnson had given Schrier. Within an hour, the patrol reached the rim of the crater. After a short fire-fight with Japanese defenders emerging from several caves, the small American flag was attached to an iron pipe and raised over the island.

24 February 1991: The I Marine Expeditionary Force and coalition forces began a ground assault on Iraqi defenses in the final chapter of Operation Desert Storm. The 1st and 2d Marine Divisions stormed into the teeth of Iraqi defenses while heavily armored allied forces attacked the Iraqi defenses in Iraq from behind. In 100 hours, U.S. and allied forces defeated the Iraqi Army.

28 February 1991: Operation Desert Storm ended when the cease- fire declared by President George Bush went into effect. I Marine Expeditionary Force has a strength of more than 92,000 making Operation Desert Storm the largest Marine Corps operation in history .A total of 24 Marines were killed in action during the Gulf War.

74th Anniversary of the Battle of Iwo Jima



The invasion of Iwo Jima began on February 19, 1945, and continued to March 26, 1945. The Marine invasion, known as "Operation Detachment", was charged with the mission of capturing the airfields on the island, which up until that time had harried U.S. bombing missions to Tokyo. The battle was marked by some of the fiercest fighting of the War. The Imperial Japanese Army positions on the island were heavily fortified, with vast bunkers, hidden artillery, and 11 mi of tunnels. Of the 21,000 Japanese soldiers present at the beginning of the battle, over 19,000 were killed and only 1,083 taken prisoner.

One of the first objectives after landing on the beachhead was the taking of Mount Suribachi. After the fall of Mount Suribachi in the south, the Japanese still held a strong position throughout the island. General Tadamichi Kuribayashi still had the equivalent of eight infantry battalions, a tank regiment, two artillery, and three heavy mortar battalions, plus the 5,000 gunners and naval infantry. With the landing area secure, more troops and heavy equipment came ashore and the invasion proceeded north to capture the airfields and the remainder of the island. Most Japanese soldiers fought to the death. On the night of March 25, a 300-man Japanese force launched a final counterattack led by Kuribayashi. The island was officially declared "secured" the following morning. The U.S. military occupied Iwo Jima until 1968, when it was returned to Japan.

The House Wounded Warrior Fellowship Program was expanded to 110 fellowships in FY19. As such, we have several openings listed below. Additionally, we will hire approximately 60 additional Fellows in 2019 so we will be recruiting veterans throughout the year. As a reminder, the House Wounded Warrior Program provides two-year paid fellowships for wounded and/or disabled veterans to work for Congress. The fellows are full-time House employees and are entitled to all the pay and benefits of other House staff. Salaries range from \$38,853 - \$51,312. Fellowships are located in DC and in Congressional offices around the country to include Delegate offices abroad.
